Ensuring Quality

As part of Internships Work, BASE is offering *free* peer reviews of a programmes self-assessment against the Supported Internship Quality Assurance Framework (SIQAF)

The SIQAF Self-assessment tool (which can be downloaded <u>here</u>) has been designed to support you to determine the quality and success of your Supported Internship programme. It will highlight your strengths and should be used as an annual continuous improvement tool. The SI provider (organisation drawing down education funding) should lead the self-assessment involving all other delivery partners.

As part of the Internships Work programme, you can also sign up to a peer review. The peer review process involves two trained peer reviewers (one lead reviewer and another peer reviewer) who will visit your Supported Internship programme over a day and a half to validate your SIQAF self-assessment score and support your continuous improvement efforts with recommended actions and good practice examples.

This process map is to support you to book and prepare for your peer review.
