Next Generation is about ensuring that Learning Disability Services are prepared for the future by ensuring tomorrow's leaders have the right skills and knowledge to drive forward change.

It is targeted at people already working in learning disability services who have the potential, in around 3-5 years from now, to be taking on senior leadership roles

The programme contains:

- A detailed focus on leadership, personal style and achieving change
- An exploration of the leadership styles needed to deliver rights, choice and control within the current economic climate
- Leading edge practice sessions on key policy priorities

This means that the people appropriate for this programme might be, for example:

- A learning disability commissioner in a local authority or CCG
- The senior learning disability manager in an NHS Trust
- Area or regional managers in a large provider
- Second tier manager in a smaller provider

The programme consists of :

- 4 x one or two day residential modules (held in the Midlands)
- Participants are required to attend all sessions.

The programme will be facilitated by Rob Greig (NDTi Chief Executive and former Government National Director for Learning Disabilities), Madeline Cooper-Ueki (NDTi Learning Disabilities Programme Lead) and Bill Love (NDTi Head of Development Support).

Costs:

The cost is £1,150 per person. This includes all programme costs, including accommodation, food and course materials.

If an organisation sends two people, the second place will cost £100 less.
