Where did we begin?

Gap identified - need for a resource that captured:

- What Young People with SEND had said about what support they needed to get employment
- What messages they would like to give employers about giving opportunities to young people like themselves
- Important that something visual
- Could be created by capturing the thoughts of young people as they were spoken
- Important that it was led by young people
- Important that it could be used in a variety of ways, including: with other young people with SEND, parents/carers and employers



What next?

- Discussion with Regional Lead to determine the brief with Franki Williams (NTDi) and Jon Ralphs (artist)
- Involvement of Young People (local FE College; Pre-Supported Internship programmes; Supported Interns; former interns now employed and SEND Youth Forum link)




What did we ask young people?

- What would a good pathway to employment look like?
- What would have helped you plan for employment when you were at school?
 - What did you need to know?
 - What challenges did you face?
 - What worked well for you and what could have been better?
- What do you want employers to know?
- What do you want us (Project Leads) to know? What would you like us to achieve in the next 2 years of the Project?
- What support do young people need to get into work?
- · Sharing aspiration of what the future looks like

What did young people say?

• "It was good to share my own experiences of how I got myself into employment and how well I have done since then and going on to achieve so much".

"I thought that this event was a great idea and useful to young people so they
can find out what the real world is actually like. I think that it was great seeing
different perspectives on how young people want to get into employment. It
was also good to share my story about how I joined the real world - getting
into the NHS with Project Choice".

- "Paid employment"



Other projects under the Internship Works

- Set up SEND employability forum:Working with Cobalt Business Park

 - Designing a programme of support for employers to increase SI, work placements and employment of SEND young people
- Post 16 SEND local provision directory and updating the local offer
- Hosted Training in Systematic Instruction to train local job coaches
 - · We have also commissioned another round of training
- Been successful in a bid to deliver a Non EHCP supportive internship
