The Basics

National Supported Internship Day (NSID) was founded by DFN Project SEARCH and takes place on March 27th annually. NSID was launched in 2023 with the aim of putting supported internships on the map, and thanks to you we achieved that. Last year, the campaign reached 8 million people across the UK and had thousands of individuals and organisations celebrating supported internships.

Building on this momentum, this year's NSID is a collaborative effort with Base and NDTi which will allow us all to reach even more young adults with learning disabilities and autism spectrum conditions.

The theme for NSID this year is **amplifying the voices of young people**. A carefully crafted program of activities has been developed to reflect this.

The aim of National Supported Internship Day is to raise awareness supported internships and the challenges facing our sector. This year, the focus is on placing young adults at the forefront of our messaging, sharing their stories across the UK.

We have a planned programme of Parliamentary activity that Youth Futures Foundation have generously agreed to sponsor, which includes a reception for over 80 interns and graduates.

Alongside the programme of activity, we will be running two competitions that are exclusive for DFN Project SEARCH sites and your support in spreading the word and creating excitement around these competitions is crucial

- NSID Reception Monday 25th March from 9:30am- 11am. This is a breakfast reception where interns and graduates will get the opportunity to share their experiences and network in Parliament.
- Parliamentary Workshop Monday 25th March from 12-2pm.
 This is a workshop where interns and graduates will develop their advocacy skills and learn how to write to their MP. They.will also take part in reverse mentoring sessions with a Member of Parliament.

Host An Event to raise awareness about SIs

Whether you are a Local Authority, a business, a SIs provider or an educator, we want you to unleash your creativity and host your own NSID celebratory event!

Events ideas for your organisations' NSID

- Q&A and Information Sessions: Facilitate a direct dialogue between attendees and panelists from various stakeholder groups, answering questions and clarifying details about SIs. Highlights benefits, eligibility, and application processes through presentations and brochures.
- <u>Drop-in Session:</u> Offer an open, flexible forum for individuals to learn about supported internships, speak one-on-one with representatives, and gather resources at their own pace.
- Youth-Employer Engagement Session (for LAs/Providers):
 Host an interactive event where young people share their supported internship experiences directly with potential employers, highlighting the value and perspectives of the future workforce.
- Interactive Workshops: Host engaging workshops with roleplaying and simulations to give attendees a hands-on understanding of supported internships, showcasing real-life challenges and achievements.
- <u>Showcase and Awards:</u> Celebrate with a showcase of intern projects and achievements, award and recognise outstanding interns, employers, and support strategies.
- <u>Experience Days:</u> Allow participants to shadow supported interns and engage with mentors for a day, providing an immersive look into the daily workings of supported internships.
- Innovation Hackathon: Invite stakeholders to a hackathon to drive innovative solutions for enhancing supported internship programmes, with the potential for winning ideas to influence and impact programmes.

- Develop a creative way to showcase your site.
 Whether that be a highlight of the sites achievements, impact or beyond.
- You can write a story, take pictures or videos of you in action, host an event, create a dance, paint a picture or beyond. The world is your creative oyster. Last year, a site completed three wainwright summits to raise awareness of their work!

People's Choice Awards Enter a Competition

- Utilise your steering committee and their connections, social media, newsletters, and other channels to promote your site and the competition to encourage votes from all of your connections as a partnership.

- Each person voting is allowed one vote.
- Voters can be anyone including people within your community, Department, Managers and Mentors as well as families parents and carers


Write to your Member of **Parliament**
